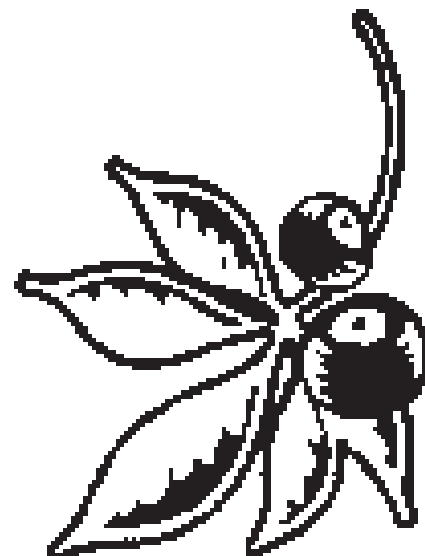

The Ohio State University at Marion is pleased to provide eligible students with a variety of sources for college funding. The Ohio State University at Marion scholarship program awards funds provided by the generous support of many area residents and organizations.

Most scholarships are only available for classes taken on the Marion campus or at the Delaware Center by Ohio State Marion students. Students must meet minimum grade requirements. Students must complete The Ohio State University at Marion Scholarship Application and meet applicable awarding criteria. The priority-processing deadline is March 3 of each year for the subsequent academic year. Students who apply after March 3 will be awarded on a funds-available basis only. Most scholarships will be prorated for less than full-time enrollment at the Marion campus or Delaware Center. Students may receive a maximum of 12 quarters of Marion campus scholarship assistance.

YOU MUST APPLY EVERY YEAR BY MARCH 3 FOR ALL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS.

Freshman Award Criteria: Students who have graduated from high school in the past year are eligible for scholarships using the following formula based on class rank or ACT scores. Students will receive the higher amount as determined by admissions records received by March 3. Current full-time tuition for an Ohio resident freshmen is \$1,888 per quarter.

New Transfer & Returning Student Award Criteria:

For any student who has completed 12 or more college hours and meets Marion County residency requirements, the following funding formula is used. The student's cumulative GPA as of March 3 is used to determine awards for the following year. Our current full-time tuition for Ohio residents is \$1,888 per quarter for freshmen and sophomores; \$2,080 per quarter for juniors and seniors.

For any student who has completed 12 or more college hours and does not meet Marion County residency requirements, the following funding formula is used:

3.2 to 3.49	\$400

Merit-Based Scholarships—Marion County

Dorothy and George H. Alber Scholarship: Recipients must demonstrate need and a high degree of academic potential.

George Alber Trust Scholarship: Established by the Alber Estate to increase the economic vitality of the Marion community. Must be a Marion County resident and/or a graduate of a Marion County high school.

Mary Alice Lyon Scholarship: Recipient must be a deserving student who has graduated from a Marion County high school.

Donald E. and Lillian Sims Scholarship: Recipients must demonstrate academic merit. Preference is for students from Marion County attending either the Marion or Columbus campus.

Harold and Francis Umbaugh Scholarship: Recipients must be graduates of Marion Harding High School.

Edwin U. Wolfinger Scholarship: Recipients must be Marion County students.

Merit-Based Scholarships—Any County

Dean's Scholarship: Two full-time tuition scholarships plus a book allowance and laptop computer are awarded to as many as two high school seniors in each of the following bachelor's degree programs: Elementary Education, English, General Business Management, History, and Psychology. Recipients must have a 27 or higher ACT composite, OR be in the top 10% of their graduating class, with a completed college preparatory high school curriculum. Applicants must complete the Marion Campus Scholarship Application by February 15 and participate in an essay competition held in March. This scholarship is renewable for up to 12 quarters of study, assuming the student maintains a 3.5 minimum cumulative GPA.

W. Keith Davis Memorial Scholarship: Preference is for deserving students.

Wm. Kay Davis Honors Award: To be used to provide honors students the opportunity to enhance the quality of their education.

Pamela and Dr. G. Scott Drew Scholarship: Preference is for any student.

Roy C. and Lillian M. Holdridge Scholarship: Recipient must be a second-year business major.

Geraldine M. and Wayne H. Kuhn Scholarship: Recipient must be in the top third of high school class and majoring in engineering, human ecology, or related sciences/social sciences.

Geraldine McFadden Kuhn Scholarship: Recipients must be deserving students entering Ohio State Marion and who are interested in pursuing a degree in human ecology or English.

Lashley/Lowe Minority Scholarship: Preference is for a student meeting minority classification.

Ralph T. Lewis Scholarship: Recipient must be a deserving student.

Loudenslager Scholarship: Recipients must be deserving students entering Ohio State Marion, residents of Ohio State Marion's seven-county service area, and interested in pursuing a degree in the College of Food, Agriculture, and Environmental Sciences or a major in human ecology in the College of Education and Human Ecology.

Marion Campus Founders Scholarship: Preference is for deserving students.

Marion Enrichment Scholarship: Preference is for deserving students.

John H. Moore Grant and Scholarship: Preference is for students intending to study architecture, engineering, or medicine.

Theodore B. Myers Scholarship: Preference is for deserving students who are studying the biological sciences.

Phi Theta Kappa Transfer Scholarship: Available to active members of Marion Technical College's PTK chapter who have earned at least 70 hours at MTC, have at least a 3.2 cumulative GPA, and apply for admission to Ohio State Marion by June 1.

Diana and Gary K. Sims Scholarship: Preference is for qualified traditional-aged students (ages 18-24).

University Provost Scholarship: Students who rank in the top 3% of their high school class and have an ACT of 29 or higher may receive up to \$2,100. Students who may be awarded another scholarship from The Ohio State University at Marion will only be awarded the higher of the two scholarships.

Merit/Need Based Scholarships for Marion County Residents (FAFSA required)

John F. Isler Scholarship: Recipient must be enrolled in College of Food, Agriculture, and Environmental Sciences and have exhibited at the Junior Fair at the Marion County Fair.

Barbara A. and Peter B. Miller Scholarship: Preference is for deserving students of sophomore or higher rank who are residents of Marion County and who have financial need.

Jane Peppard Scholarship: Recipients must be residents of Marion County who have demonstrated financial need or a high degree of academic potential or scholastic ability.

Merit/Need Based Scholarships – Any County (FAFSA required)

Marion Campus Access Scholarship: Students must file a FAFSA and demonstrate need.

Ava King Brown Scholarship: Preference is sophomore or higher rank students pursuing a degree in social work, psychology, or other helping professions. Criteria shall include high academic potential, scholastic ability, and financial need.

Warren Brown Scholarship: Preference for sophomore or higher rank students studying business administration with an emphasis in marketing or finance. Criteria shall include high academic potential, scholastic ability, and financial need.

Evelyn G. and George R. Ghearing Scholarship: Preference is for students studying education, engineering, or business.

A. Merle and Pearl (Gray) Hamilton Scholarship: Recipients must demonstrate financial need or a high degree of academic potential or scholastic ability. Preference is for students majoring in agriculture, medicine, engineering, or the arts.

Sara P. Sprague Howser Scholarship: Preference is for students of sophomore or higher rank, majoring in elementary education. Criteria shall include financial need, worthiness of character, overall performance, and classification as a full-time student.

Marion Campus Minority Scholarship: Preference is for a student meeting minority classification who demonstrates financial need.

Larry Prude Memorial Scholarship: Preference is for a student meeting minority classification.

Susan Galloway Swavel Scholarship: Recipients must be pursuing studies in elementary education and demonstrate financial need.

Ruby and Jack Weis Scholarship: Recipients must have demonstrated financial need, a high degree of academic potential and scholastic ability, and a record of good citizenship and service to others. Preference is for students in engineering or scientific studies.

Need Based Scholarships – Any County (FAFSA and minimum 2.5 GPA required)

Oliver E. Hamilton Family Scholarship: Preference is for a single parent who has demonstrated financial need.

Francis and Virginia Hazard Scholarship: Preference is for students who have identified disabilities or handicaps.

Evelyn E. Walter Scholarship: Preference is for second-year and non-traditional students who have demonstrated need.

Step-up Grants: Preference given to students who are age 24 or older and have not been enrolled at an institution of higher education for the 12 prior months nor have a bachelor's degree.

Consolidated Electric Cooperative Scholarship: Recipients must be Consolidated Electric cooperative members or dependents of members.

Other Academic Awards for Current Ohio State Marion Students

Margaret A. and Theodore A. Hendricks Study/Travel Scholarship: Preference to sophomores and above, studying humanities, social sciences, education, public service, or business. Students must have completed two quarters of study in world history, geography, political science or an honors option with grade B or higher, professor's recommendation, and agree to present three travel programs. Travel to be outside the United States or to areas of U.S. representing American Indian or non-native culture.

Oliver E. Hamilton History Awards: The Oliver E. Hamilton Achievement Award is given to a junior or senior history major with the highest GPA. Two additional writing awards will be given respectively to one freshman or sophomore student and one junior or senior student who author the best papers.

Marion Campus Student Travel Awards: Awarded to qualifying students who participate in approved Marion campus study abroad programs.

The C. Eugene Maynard Award: Awarded to an outstanding senior at Ohio State Marion.

The John Mount Academic Award: Awarded to an outstanding senior who began his or her academic career on the Marion campus.

The Babich Writing Award: Awarded to two students, one to the author of the best paper by a freshman or sophomore and one for the best paper by a junior or senior.
